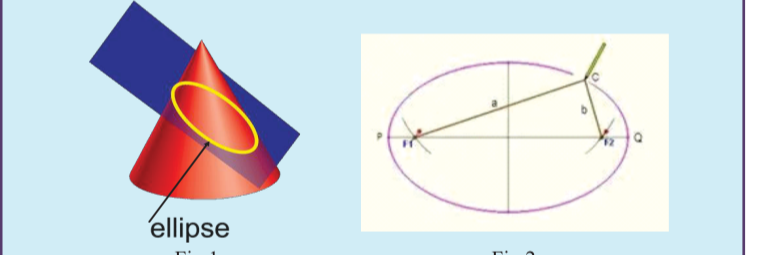
Our elders,

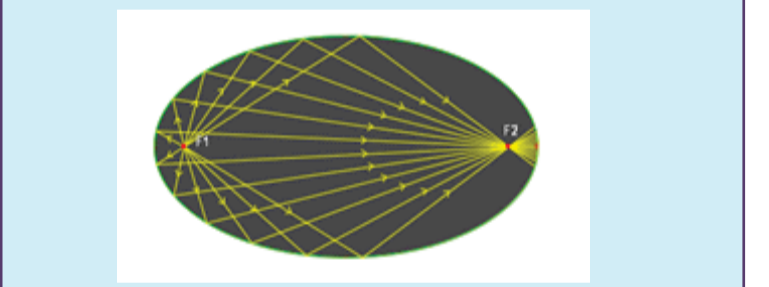

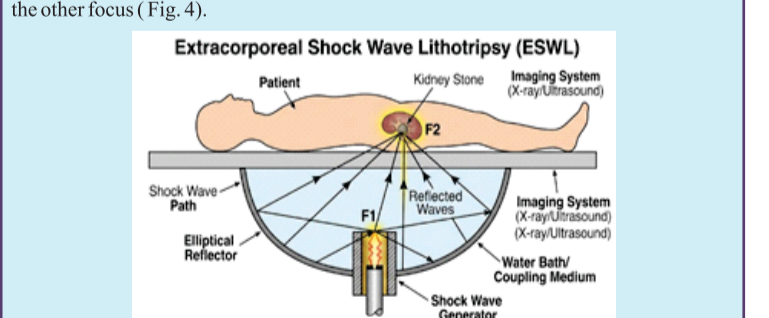
When a cone is sliced obliquely through its midpoint, the cross-sectional shape formed is an ellipse (Fig.1). Another method to construct an ellipse involves a string: by pinning both ends of the string and keeping it taut, then moving it, you trace out an ellipse. The two fixed pins are called the foci F_1 and F_2 (Fig.2).



A fascinating property of ellipses is that any ray emanating from one focus, after reflecting off the ellipse boundary, will pass through the other focus (Fig. 3).



This principle has profound applications. One of the most significant uses of this geometric property is in Extracorporeal Shock Wave Lithotripsy (ESWL), a medical procedure in which a device featuring an elliptical wall is employed. The shock wave generator is placed at one focus, while the target—such as a kidney stone—is located at the other focus (Fig. 4).



As the shock waves reflect off the elliptical surface, they converge precisely at the stone, breaking it apart. This innovation offers several key benefits: it avoids surgery, reduces cost, and requires minimal recovery time.

In summary, this remarkable collaboration between engineers, leveraging geometric principles, and medical experts has transformed kidney stone treatment.

This breakthrough was realized in the 1980s through the pioneering work of Christian Chaussy and his colleagues, in partnership with Dornier MedTech in Germany.

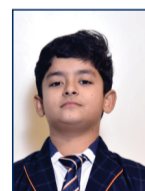
ECHOES OF THE MORROW
